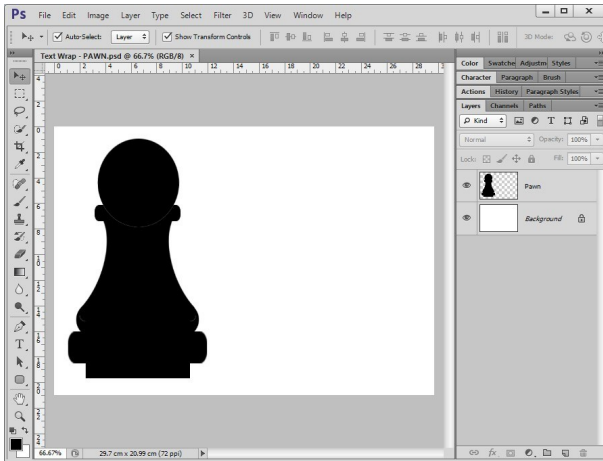
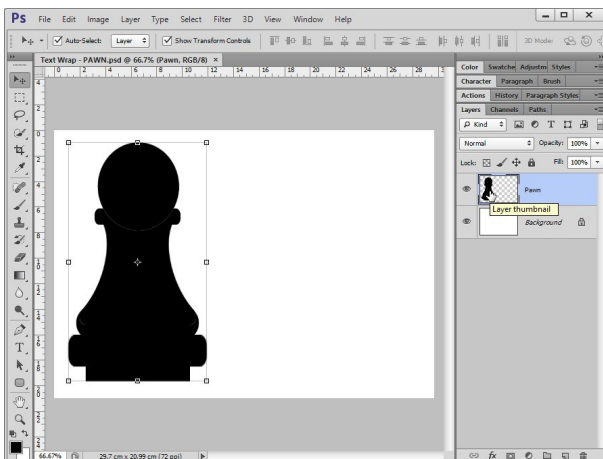


How to wrap text around an object - Photoshop CS6 - by Isac Images

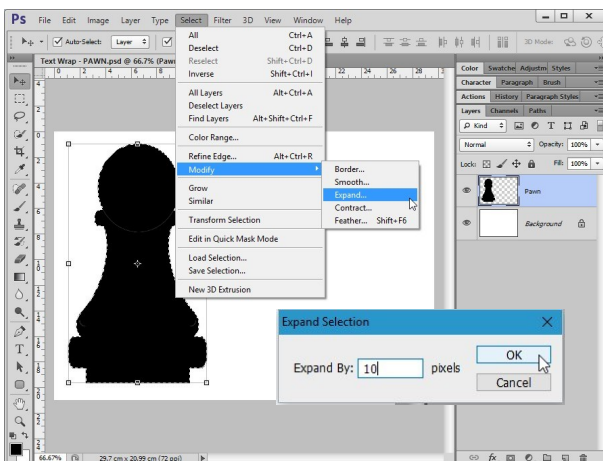
Original image of a pawn chess piece. This method works on any shape you wish to select.



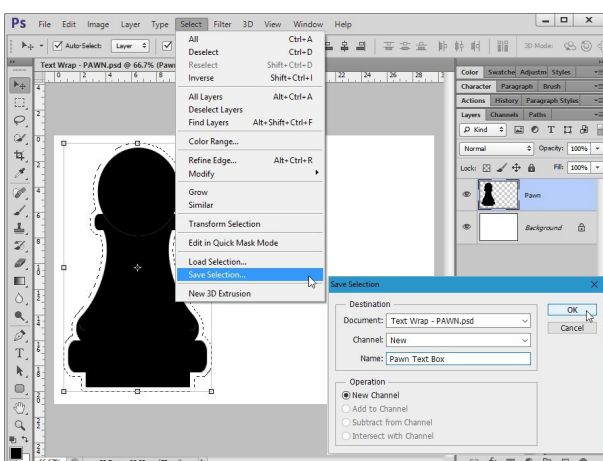
1: Select the object shape by holding **CTRL** and clicking the **Layer Thumbnail**.



2: On the TOP Menu, click **Select > Modify > Expand**. Enter 10 Pixels then click OK.

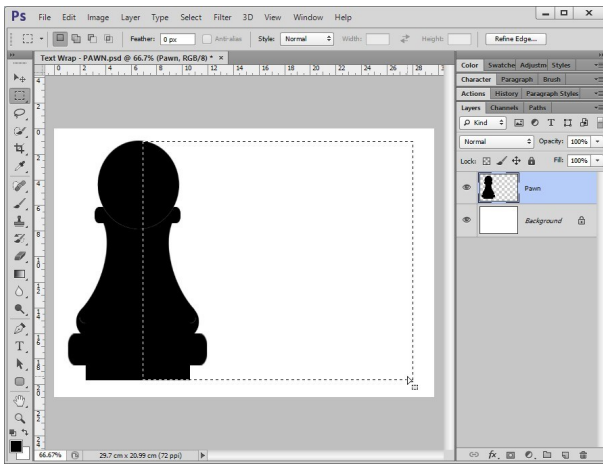


3: On the TOP Menu, click **Select > Save Selection** - name it (I used PAWN) then click OK.



4: Unselect - **CTRL+D**.

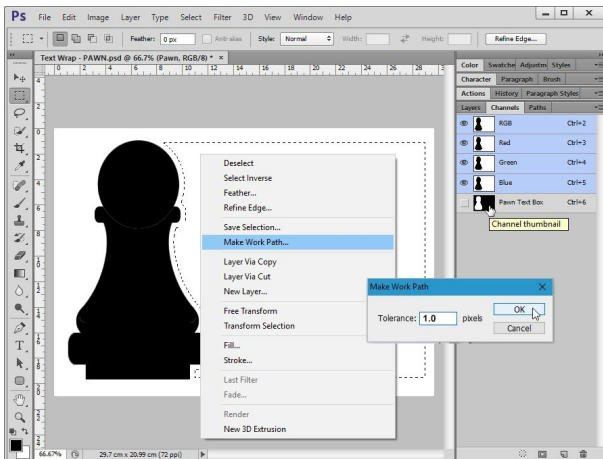
5: Select the **Marquee Tool**, draw a box which should overlap your object shape.



6: Click **CHANNELS** Palette and while holding **CTRL+ALT**, click on the **Channel Thumbnail**.

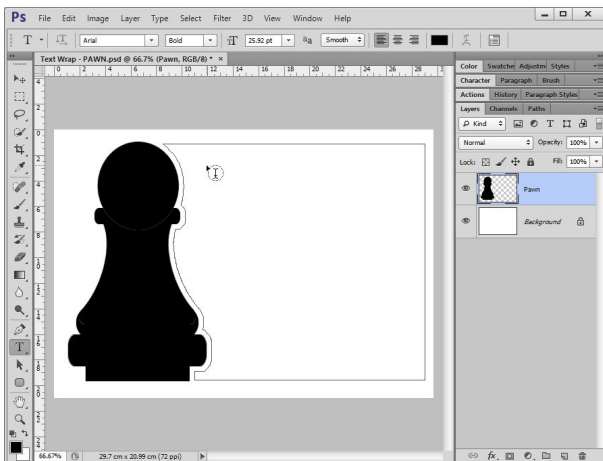
7: With the Marquee Tool still selected, Right Click inside the marching ants selection.

8: **Make Work Path** - Tolerance .5 or higher and click OK.

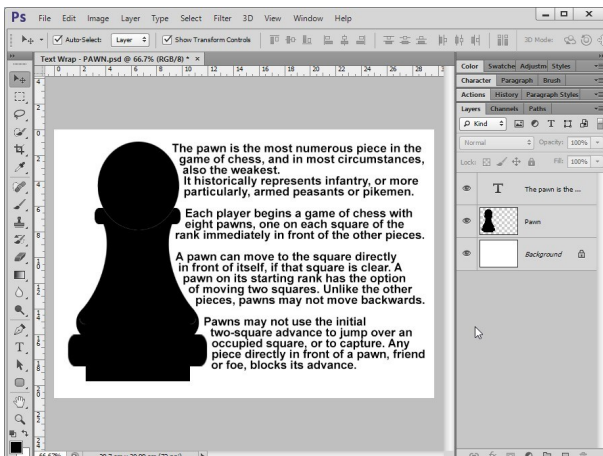


9: Now, click on the **LAYERS** Palette, and click on your object layer to make it active.

10: Select the **TEXT Tool** and click into the new text box. The cursor changes to a Circle.



11: Enter you text and it will conform to the new shape.
